OUR APPROACH



LEAP provides a comprehensive set of programs that include these four essential elements:

- **ACADEMIC:** Real-world learning
- opportunities with linkages between learning and careers.
- **SOCIAL-EMOTIONAL:** Services to build
- 2 intrapersonal skills like teamwork and interpersonal skills like self-advocacy.
- **EDUCATION AND CAREER:** Creation of a plan for post-secondary and career success, with ongoing advising.
- **4 SOCIAL CAPITAL:** Networking with trusted adults in formal and informal settings.

PROGRAMS AND SERVICES

LEAP programs span 6th grade through post-secondary education and into the workforce, including:

EXPANDING HORIZONS (Salem)

Year-round middle school program that focuses on academic and social-emotional enrichment.

TEEN CENTER (Salem)

After-school program that offers academic support, community engagement, and mentoring.

COLLEGE SUCCESS (Salem and Peabody)

Support throughout the college application process, including financial aid and scholarships for students and families.

Ongoing student advising through post-secondary graduation to address any barrier to success.

INTERNSHIP (Salem and Gloucester)

A summer program offering work-based learning experiences and workshops.

EARLY COLLEGE (Salem)

Partnership at Salem High School in which students take college credit courses with ongoing college and career services.
